



Presentation of Action Plan

The Presentation of Action Plan is *optional*, but requested, for GIPS teams at Virtual IC 2021. GIPS teams that do not submit a Presentation of Action Plan will still be able to advance in the booklet competition, and GIPS Individuals may submit a PAP this year for fun! Below, key aspects of the competition are discussed to help you prepare for IC 2021. Additional information will be released after registration has closed. TIMELINE

- Thursday, May 6 - Registration closes www.icfpspi.org
- Thursday, May 13 - Payments due
- Thursday, May 20 - All documentation for accommodations (504, educational, disability, etc.) due

COMPETITION DETAILS

The format of the Presentation is very open-ended. Students should choose a format that excites them and provides the ability to collaborate given environmental constraints. The Presentation should take into account the scoring elements being considered on the score sheet.

Potential formats:

- Recording of traditional skit performance
- Video project using original audio/visual (editing is acceptable and encouraged)
- Recorded slide show
- Stop Motion Animation
- Screencast of gameplay, etc.
- Record a Zoom call

Requirements:

- The Presentation can be no more than four (4) minutes long.
- The Underlying Problem and Action Plan **summary** must be read at the beginning of the recording, prior to the Presentation of Action Plan itself. This **will not count** toward the four minute time limit. Please limit your Action Plan summary to 90 seconds. Do not read your entire Action Plan.
- Only one Presentation per GIPS team or individual registration may be submitted.
- The Presentation must be submitted as an unlisted YouTube link via Google Forms at <http://tinyurl.com/2021pap>. Participants in countries that have blocked YouTube must contact elizabeth@fpspi.org to make alternate arrangements.
- All work in the Presentation must be the participants' original creation and **may not use copyrighted materials** (characters, music, etc.).
- Students may spend *no more than 8 hours* preparing their Presentation of Action Plan.
- Only the members of the Presentation may contribute to the work submitted, including editing and revising.



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Team composition:

- Any or all members of the same GIPS team, and additional competitors **from the same registration** (up to 7 students in total) may collaborate on the Presentation. Additional PAP members of PAP can be from GIPS Individual, Scenario Writing, Scenario Performance, or Community Problem Solving
- At least one member of the GIPS team must be involved in the presentation.
- GIPS individuals may submit a Presentation of Action Plan for a “Fan Favorite” competition. These presentations will not be evaluated using traditional evaluation score sheets.

Resources:

- The mandatory prop(s) and quote as announced during the Opening Ceremony
- While students do not need to use every prop on this resource list, additional items should **not** be added. Physical or digital versions of the following items may be used:
 - 1 roll of tape
 - Pens/pencils
 - 1 roll of aluminum foil
 - 1 cardboard box
 - 10 sheets of 8 1/2 x 11 or A4 paper (colored, newspaper, blank, lined, used, or otherwise)
 - 1 set of 8 water-soluble colored markers
 - Appropriate costumes and face make-up/painting are acceptable for IC 2021
 - Up to 4 chairs may be safely utilized
 - 12 pipe cleaners
 - 1 magazine
 - 1 cloth towel
 - 1 pillowcase

EVALUATION

Presentation of Action Plans, developed in response to the IC 2021 Future Scene, are evaluated following the official [Evaluation Guidelines](#). Presentations are evaluated based on relationship to Action Plan, creativity of Presentation, persuasiveness of Presentation, completeness of Presentation, incorporation of props, verbal communication of ideas, nonverbal communication of ideas, staging, preparation, and dramatic style elements. Presentations are evaluated and ranking is determined based upon total points and rank. Final Round will also include a “Fan Favorite” voting by student IC participants. This is separate from FPSP’s evaluation.

Awards are given for top Presentation of Action Plans by division, and will be announced during the Award Ceremony on Monday, June 14. Following the conclusion of the Award Ceremony, score sheets will be available in FPSONline. Awards will be mailed to the address on file for the coordinator as provided during registration. NOTE: Awards for Non-US winners will be mailed to their Affiliate Director for distribution.

RULES

When competitors register for IC 2021, they are required to complete the FPSP International Conference Publication Release/Statement of Authenticity and Competitor Rules and Regulations Contract, which indicates violation of any rules may result in disqualification. Please note the following:

- The preparation, creation, and Presentation is the original work and the sole creation of the registered student’s own effort and ideas.
- The Presentation does not include copyrighted materials (characters, music, etc.).
- The work was completed without any outside assistance except for technological/videographic support.
- Work was completed within the designated competition timeframe without any outside assistance.
