Over the past decades, Dr. Ed Selby, Dr. Donald Treffinger, and others have developed, perfected, and shared Creative Problem Solving with thousands of educators through their books, research articles, online modules, and face to face workshops such as this one. Improvisation, or **improv**, is a form of live performance which the plot, characters and dialogue of a game, scene or story are made up in the moment. Often improvisers will take a suggestion from the audience, or draw on some other source of inspiration to get started. Learn how improv can help students develop public speaking skills and grow comfortable speaking in front of an audience. Improv can help FPSP students boost their creativity and brainstorm ideas.

In our workshop, we will cover the following elements:

1. Whole-group improvisation
2. One-on-one interactive improvisation
3. Small group improvisation
4. Using "yes" and "accept" for improv storytelling
5. Always be listening
6. Relax and have fun
